## Preamble

2 WHEREAS, Community and faith-based organizations are uniquely able to 3 provide services to Maryland citizens in need of assistance in meeting basic human 4 needs; and

5 WHEREAS, The General Assembly has long recognized the ability of 6 community and faith-based organizations to provide services to citizens and has 7 partnered with these organizations with capital improvements through legislative 8 initiatives in the State capital budget; and

9 WHEREAS, Partnerships between the State and community and faith-based 10 organizations facilitate the seamless provision of human services; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly intends to continue to provide financial
 assistance to community and faith-based organizations that provide human services;
 and

WHEREAS, A mechanism is needed to connect community and faith-based
organizations and State agencies to better enable them to exchange information,
coordinate resources, provide technical assistance, and serve as a clearinghouse to

 ORGANIZATIONS THAT PROVIDE HUMAN SERVICES, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR

24 (2) THE TERMS OF APPOINTED MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS
25 REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL ON OCTOBER
26 1, 2003.

27 (3) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A 28 SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.

29(4)A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES30ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.

(F) THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES, THE DEPARTMENT OF
HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, THE DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE
JUSTICE, THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, AND THE OFFICE
FOR CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND FAMILIES SHALL JOINTLY PROVIDE STAFF SUPPORT TO
THE COUNCIL.
