3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a certain law enforcement unit to dispose of a

- 4 forfeited handgun by sale, exchange, or transfer to a certain licensed firearms
- 5 dealer; requiring a certain law enforcement unit to send certain information
- 6 about the dealer to the Secretary of State Police; requiring a certain law
- 7 enforcement agency seeking to dispose of a firearm in the possession of the
- 8 agency to do so in certain ways, including by sale, exchange, or transfer to a
