13 14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
15	Article 83B - Department of Housing and Community Development

17	(d) The MHT Loan Fund may be used for the following purposes:
18 19	(1) To make loans to nonprofit organizations, local jurisdictions, business entities, and individuals for the purpose of:
20 21	(i) Acquiring, rehabilitating, [or] restoring, OR REFINANCING historic properties; or
24	(ii) Short-term financing for costs directly related to work required or recommended by the Trust or the State Historic Preservation Officer to be undertaken before proceeding with or continuing a construction project in the State being funded with federal or State moneys, which may include the costs of studies,

26 surveys, plans and specifications, and architectural, engineering, or other special 27 services;

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- 1 (2) To cover administrative costs directly related to the MHT Loan 2 Program;
- 3 (3) To fund the purchase or acquisition by the Trust of historic properties
- 4 or partial interests in historic properties for use in accordance with the Trust's
- 5 authorized purposes or for resale or lease subject to appropriate preservation
- 6 covenants; and
- 7 (4) To fund the costs of restoration or rehabilitation of historic properties
- 8 owned by the Trust for use in accordance with the Trust's authorized purposes or for
- 9 resale or lease subject to appropriate preservation covenants, which may include costs
- 10 directly related to restoration or rehabilitation such as the cost of studies, surveys,
- 11 plans and specifications, and architectural, engineering, or other special services.
- 12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 July 1, 2003.
