- 6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 7 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 8 Article Education
- 9 7-206.1.
- 10 (a) (1) AN INDIVIDUAL HONORABLY DISCHARGED FROM MILITARY SERVICE
- 11 MAY APPLY TO OBTAIN A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA IF THE INDIVIDUAL WITHDREW
- 12 FROM A REGULAR FULL-TIME PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SCHOOL ACCREDITED BY THE
- 13 STATE BOARD DURING THE INDIVIDUAL'S JUNIOR OR SENIOR YEAR IN HIGH SCHOOL
- 14 TO ENLIST IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES DURING WORLD WAR II.
- 15 (2) An individual honorably discharged from military service may apply
- 16 to obtain a high school diploma if the individual withdrew from a regular full-time
- 17 public or private *HIGH* school accredited by the State Board during the individual's
- 18 senior year in high school to enlist in the armed forces of the United States during
- 19 [World War II or] the Korean Conflict.
- 20 (b) To obtain a high school diploma under subsection (a) of this section, the
- 21 individual shall apply to the county board in the county where the individual resides
- 22 or where the school from which the individual withdrew was located.
- 23 (c) Each county board shall adopt rules and regulations to establish
- 24 procedures for awarding diplomas under this section.
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
- 26 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,
- 27 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
- 28 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from
- 29 the date it is enacted.
