- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 Article - Environment

- 16 (a) (1) A person who willfully violates any provision of this subtitle or any
- 17 rule or regulation adopted under this subtitle is liable for a civil penalty not exceeding
- 18 \$5,000 to be collected in a civil action.
- 19 Each day a violation continues is a separate violation under this
- 20 subsection.
- 21 (3) If the Attorney General concurs, the Secretary may compromise and
- 22 settle any claim for a civil penalty under this subtitle.
- 23 (b) A person [who previously has been assessed a civil penalty under this
- 24 subtitle and] who willfully violates any provision of this subtitle or any rule or
- 25 regulation adopted under this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction,
- 26 is subject:

- 1 (1) For a first offense, to a fine not exceeding \$20,000 OR 2 IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR BOTH; or
- 3 (2) For a second or subsequent offense, to a fine not exceeding \$25,000, 4 or imprisonment not exceeding 2 years or both.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 6 October 1, 2003.
