### 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Business Regulation - Refueling Service - Drivers with Disabilities

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering and clarifying the requirement that certain retail service
- 4 station dealers provide certain services for certain drivers with disabilities;
- 5 altering the application of a certain requirement that a retail service station
- 6 dealer provide fueling services to certain drivers with disabilities; defining a
- 7 certain term; and generally relating to requiring refueling services for drivers
- 8 with disabilities.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

#### 16 Article - Business Regulation

17 10-320.

- 18 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "RETAIL SERVICE STATION DEALER" INCLUDES ANY
- 19 RETAIL OUTLET THAT SELLS MOTOR FUEL.
- 20 (B) A RETAIL SERVICE STATION DEALER SHALL PROVIDE SIGNAGE TO ADVISE
- 21 A CUSTOMER WITH DISABILITIES ON HOW TO OBTAIN ASSISTANCE FOR FUELING
- 22 SERVICE.
- 23 [(a)] (C) Except as provided in subsection [(b) or (c)] (D) OR (E) of this section,
- 24 a retail service station dealer [who reduces the price of motor fuel for self-service]
- 25 shall provide, on request, fueling service at the self-service price to a disabled driver

- 1 who displays a VALID disabled person's registration plate or parking permit [issued 2 by the Motor Vehicle Administration]. (D) This section does not apply to a retail service station dealer [who 4 sells motor fuel from] OPERATED BY ONLY ONE EMPLOYEE PER SHIFT[: 5 (1) a convenience store that: sells motor fuel through remotely controlled dispensing 6 (i) equipment; and 8 (ii) does not provide fueling service; or 9 a station that: (2) 10 (i) is exclusively self-service; 11 (ii) is operated by 1 cashier; and 12 (iii) has remotely controlled dispensing equipment]. 13 This section does not apply to a disabled driver who: [(c)](E) 14 is reasonably capable of providing self-service; or (1) 15 (2) drives a motor vehicle that carries another individual who is 16 reasonably capable of providing self-service.
- 17 [(d)] (F) A retail service station dealer who violates this section is guilty of a 18 misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to a fine not exceeding \$25.
- 19 SECTION 2. AND IT BE FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 20 October 1, 2003.
