14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Business Regulation

18 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "RETAIL SERVICE STATION DEALER" INCLUDES ANY19 RETAIL OUTLET THAT SELLS MOTOR FUEL.

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1 (B) A RETAIL SERVICE STATION DEALER SHALL PROVIDE SIGNAGE TO ADVISE 2 A CUSTOMER WITH DISABILITIES ON HOW TO OBTAIN ASSISTANCE FOR FUELING **3 SERVICE.**

4 [(a)] (C) Except as provided in subsection [(b) or (c)] (D) OR (E) of this section,

5 a retail service station dealer [who reduces the price of motor fuel for self-service]

6 shall provide, on request, fueling service at the self-service price to a disabled driver

7 who displays a VALID disabled person's registration plate or parking permit [issued

8 by the Motor Vehicle Administration OR ANY OTHER AUTHORIZED GOVERNMENT

9 AGENCY.

10 (D) This section does not apply to a retail service station dealer [who [(b)] 11 sells motor fuel from] OPERATED BY ONLY ONE EMPLOYEE PER SHIFT[:

- 20 [(c)] (E) This section does not apply to a disabled driver who:

A retail service station dealer who violates this section is guilty of a 24 [(d)] (F) 25 misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to a fine not exceeding \$25.

SECTION 2. AND IT BE FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 26 27 October 1, 2003.

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
