### Natural Resources - Roadside Trees - Permit Requirements

3 FOR the purpose of establishing certain additional requirements for obtaining a

- 4 permit for cutting down or trimming roadside trees; and generally relating to
- 5 the cutting down and trimming of roadside trees.

# 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### **Article - Natural Resources**

14 5-406.

15 (a) Any person who desires to cut down or trim any roadside tree shall apply 16 to the Department for a permit, except that:

17 (1) if a tree is unrooted or its branches broken so as to contact telephone,

18 telegraph, electric power, or other wires carrying electric current, or if the tree or its

19 branches endanger persons or property, the tree or its branches may be removed

20 without first obtaining a permit from the Department; and

21 (2) a tree standing within the right-of-way of a public road which has

22 not been surfaced with either stone, shell, gravel, concrete, brick, asphalt, or other

23 improved surface may be cut down and removed by the abutting landowner for his

24 own use without first obtaining a permit.

1 (b) A person may not cut down, trim, mutilate, or in any manner injure any 2 roadside tree, except as authorized by this section, without a permit from the

3 Department.

4 (C) TO OBTAIN A PERMIT UNDER THIS SECTION, A PERSON SHALL 5 DEMONSTRATE THAT THE PROPOSED TREE CARE WILL:

6 (1) ELIMINATE A HAZARD TO PROPERTY, PUBLIC SAFETY, OR PUBLIC 7 HEALTH;

8 (2) IMPROVE OR PREVENT A DETERIORATED TREE CONDITION; OR

9 (3) IMPROVE THE GENERAL AESTHETIC APPEARANCE OF THE 10 RIGHT-OF-WAY.

11 (D) THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION SHALL APPLY WHETHER THE 12 ROADSIDE TREE IS LOCATED ON PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROPERTY.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 14 effect October 1, 2003.
