## Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

- 2 4-301.
- 3 (b) Except as provided in § 4-302 of this subtitle, the District Court also has
- 4 exclusive original jurisdiction in a criminal case in which a person at least 18 years
- 5 old or a corporation is charged with:
- 6 (8) Violation of §§ 8-601 through 8-604 AND 8-609 of the Criminal Law
- 7 Article, WHETHER A FELONY OR MISDEMEANOR;
- 8 4-302.
- 9 (a) Except as provided in § 4-301(b)(2), (6), (7), (8), (9), (10), (11), (12), (13),
- 10 (14), (15), (16), (17), and (18) of this subtitle, the District Court does not have
- 11 jurisdiction to try a criminal case charging the commission of a felony.
- 12 (d) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the
- 13 jurisdiction of the District Court is concurrent with that of the circuit court in a
- 14 criminal case:
- 15 (i) In which the penalty may be confinement for 3 years or more or
- 16 a fine of \$2,500 or more; or
- 17 (ii) Which is a felony, as provided in § 4-301(b)(2), (6), (7), (8), (9),
- 18 (10), (11), (12), (13), (14), (15), (16), (17), and (18) of this subtitle.
- 19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 20 October 1, 2003.
