12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Family Law

15 2-408.

16 (a) [(1)] An authorized official may not give or offer to give any reward to any 17 person as an inducement to direct to the authorized official any individual who is

18 contemplating marriage.

19 [(2) A person may not erect or maintain any information booth or 20 advertisement that is intended to help solicit the performance of any marriage 21 ceremony.]

22 (b) [(1)] An authorized official who violates the provisions of subsection 23 [(a)(1)] (A) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a 24 fine not exceeding \$50 for each offense.

25 [(2) A person who violates the provisions of subsection (a)(2) of this 26 section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject:

1 (i) for the first offense, to a fine not exceeding \$100; and

2 (ii) for each subsequent offense, to a fine not exceeding \$500 or 3 imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or both.]

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 5 effect October 1, 2003.
