2 Harford County - Highways - Prohibition on Use for Solicitation

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting, in Harford County, a person from standing in a
- 4 roadway, median divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations from the
- 5 occupant of a vehicle; and generally relating to restrictions on the use of
- 6 highways for solicitation in Harford County.

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 Article - Transportation

- 16 (a) Except for the occupant of a disabled vehicle who seeks the aid of another
- 17 vehicle, a person may not stand in a roadway to solicit a ride, employment, or
- 18 business from the occupant of any vehicle.
- 19 (b) A person may not stand on or near a highway to solicit any other person to
- 20 watch or guard any vehicle while it is parked or about to be parked on a highway.
- 21 (c) In Charles County AND HARFORD COUNTY, a person may not stand in a
- 22 roadway, median divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations of any kind
- 23 from the occupant of a vehicle.
- 24 (d) (1) In Prince George's County:
- 25 (i) A child under the age of 15 years may not stand in a roadway,
- 26 median divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations of any kind from the
- 27 occupant of a vehicle; and

- 1 (ii) An adult may not cause, encourage, allow, or petition a child 2 under the age of 15 years to stand in a roadway, median divider, or intersection to 2 policit manage of any kind from the accurant of a validable.

- 4 (2) A child under the age of 15 years may not be found guilty or
- $5 \ \ \text{adjudicated delinquent for a violation of paragraph (1)(i) of this subsection if an adult}$

- 7 this subsection.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
