16 (a) Except for the occupant of a disabled vehicle who seeks the aid of another 17 vehicle, a person may not stand in a roadway to solicit a ride, employment, or 18 business from the occupant of any vehicle.

19 (b) A person may not stand on or near a highway to solicit any other person to 20 watch or guard any vehicle while it is parked or about to be parked on a highway.

- In Charles County AND HARFORD COUNTY, a person may not stand in a 1 (c) 2 roadway, median divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations of any kind 3 from the occupant of a vehicle. 4 (d) (1) In Prince George's County: 5 A child under the age of 15 years may not stand in a roadway, 6 median divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations of any kind from the 7 occupant of a vehicle; and 8 An adult may not cause, encourage, allow, or petition a child 9 under the age of 15 years to stand in a roadway, median divider, or intersection to 10 solicit money or donations of any kind from the occupant of a vehicle. 11 A child under the age of 15 years may not be found guilty or 12 adjudicated delinquent for a violation of paragraph (1)(i) of this subsection if an adult
