10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

### **Article - Education**

14 (a) Unless it fails to meet the applicable school bus and motor vehicle safety 15 standards, a conventional school bus may be operated for [12] 15 years.

16(b)Notwithstanding the [12-year] 15-YEAR limitation in subsection (a) of17this section, a conventional school bus may be operated for additional years if:

18 (1) The bus is maintained under a preventive maintenance plan

19 approved by the Motor Vehicle Administration and the Automotive Safety

20 Enforcement Division of the Department of State Police that includes an inspection at

21 the end of the [12th] 15TH year and a minimum of 2 inspections by the Motor Vehicle

fatigue, or any other cause are certified by an independent expert approved by the
Motor Vehicle Administration to meet or exceed the manufacturer's original
