20 21	The Ethics Commission may reinstate the registration of an individual whose registration as a regulated lobbyist has been revoked or suspended under subsection (e) of this section if the Commission determines that reinstatement of the individual would not be detrimental to the public interest and the integrity of the governmental process, based on:						
23 24	(i) the nature and circumstances of the original misconduct or violation leading to revocation or suspension;						
25	(ii) the individual's subsequent conduct and reformation; and						
26 27	(iii) the present ability of the individual to comply with the provisions of the ethics law.						
	[(g)] (I) (1) If the respondent is a regulated lobbyist, for each report required under Subtitle 7 of this title that is filed late the respondent shall pay a fee of \$10 for each late day, not to exceed a total of \$250.						
	1 (2) If the respondent is an official, for each financial disclosure 2 statement found to have been filed late, the respondent shall pay a fee of \$2 for each 3 late day, not to exceed a total of \$250.
