- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing a mother to breast-feed her child in any public or

11 Preamble

- 12 WHEREAS, More than 2 decades of research have established that breast-fed
- 13 infants have lower rates of hospital admissions, ear infections, diarrhea, rashes,
- 14 allergies, and other medical problems than bottle-fed infants; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The American Academy of Pediatrics states that human milk is
- 16 made for human infants and meets all their specific nutritional needs; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Human breast milk contains antibodies from the mother that can
- 18 help an infant resist infections; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The American Academy of Pediatrics and the National Association
- 20 of Pediatric Nurse Associates and Practitioners recommend breast-feeding for as long
- 21 as possible during a child's first year of life; and
- WHEREAS, Health experts have stated that increased breast-feeding rates
- 23 could save infant lives; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Government and private experts are working to raise the rate of
- 25 breast-feeding of infants; and
- 26 WHEREAS, No mother should be made to feel incriminated or socially
- 27 ostracized for breast-feeding her child; and

- WHEREAS, The State is interested in the promotion of family values and to
- 2 that end encourages public acceptance of this basic act of nurture between a mother
- 3 and her child; and
- 4 WHEREAS, There is a social and economic benefit for the State in the creation
- 5 of an atmosphere in which a mother can feel safe and confident about breast-feeding
- 6 her child; now, therefore,
- 7 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 8 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 9 Article Health General
- 10 SUBTITLE 8. BREAST-FEEDING.
- 11 20-801.
- 12 (A) A MOTHER MAY BREAST-FEED HER CHILD IN ANY PUBLIC OR PRIVATE
- 13 LOCATION IN WHICH THE MOTHER AND CHILD ARE AUTHORIZED TO BE.
- 14 (B) A PERSON MAY NOT RESTRICT OR LIMIT THE RIGHT OF A MOTHER TO
- 15 BREAST-FEED HER CHILD.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 17 October 1, 2003.
