- 17 A PERSON WHO IS CONVICTED OF OBSTRUCTING OR HINDERING A LAW
- 18 ENFORCEMENT OFFICER IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THE OFFICER'S DUTY IS GUILTY
- 19 OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT
- 20 EXCEEDING 3 YEARS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$3,000 OR BOTH.
- 21 COMMITTEE NOTE (COMMITTEE TO REVISE ARTICLE 27): A 3-year
- 22 maximum sentence is recommended for the common law crime of obstructing or
- 23 hindering a law enforcement officer in the performance of the officer's duty because
- 24 the Commission on Criminal Sentencing Policy has classified the common law crime
- 25 as a Seriousness Category VI offense and a number of other offenses in this category
- 26 carry a maximum penalty of 3 years imprisonment, including escape in the second
- 27 degree.

- 3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 4 October 1, 2003.
