# 2 Vehicle Laws - Suspension of Driver's License - Theft of Motor Fuel

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing for a first offense, and requiring for a second or
- 4 subsequent offense, the Motor Vehicle Administration to suspend, for a certain
- 5 period of time, the driver's license of a person who is convicted of a theft offense
- 6 involving the failure to pay for motor fuel after the motor fuel was dispensed
- 7 into a vehicle; requiring a court to notify the Motor Vehicle Administration of
- 8 certain violations involving the theft of motor fuel; requiring a court to notify a
- 9 person who is convicted of a certain theft offense that the person's driver's
- 10 license may be suspended; requiring the Chief Judge of the District Court and
- the Administrative Office of the Courts, in conjunction with the Motor Vehicle
- Administration, to establish certain procedures; providing for a certain hearing
- on the request of a licensee under certain circumstances; and generally relating
- to the suspension of the driver's license of a person who is convicted of a theft
- offense involving the failure to pay for motor fuel after the motor fuel was
- dispensed into a vehicle.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 9 MARYLAND, That Section(s) 7-104(h) of Article - Criminal Law of the Annotated 10 Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7-104(i). 11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland 12 read as follows: 13 **Article - Criminal Law** 14 7-104. 15 A person may not willfully or knowingly obtain or exert unauthorized 16 control over property, if the person: 17 intends to deprive the owner of the property; (1) 18 willfully or knowingly uses, conceals, or abandons the property in a 19 manner that deprives the owner of the property; or 20 uses, conceals, or abandons the property knowing the use, 21 concealment, or abandonment probably will deprive the owner of the property. 22 (b) A person may not obtain control over property by willfully or knowingly 23 using deception, if the person: 24 intends to deprive the owner of the property; (1) 25 (2) willfully or knowingly uses, conceals, or abandons the property in a 26 manner that deprives the owner of the property; or 27 uses, conceals, or abandons the property knowing the use, 28 concealment, or abandonment probably will deprive the owner of the property. 29 IF A PERSON IS CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION UNDER THIS SECTION (H) (1)30 FOR FAILURE TO PAY FOR MOTOR FUEL AFTER THE MOTOR FUEL WAS DISPENSED 31 INTO A VEHICLE, THE COURT SHALL: NOTIFY THE PERSON THAT THE PERSON'S DRIVER'S LICENSE (I) 33 MAY BE SUSPENDED UNDER § 16-206.1 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE; AND

- 3 (2) THE CHIEF JUDGE OF THE DISTRICT COURT AND THE

- 5 VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION, SHALL ESTABLISH UNIFORM PROCEDURES FOR
- 6 REPORTING A VIOLATION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.

- 9 (A) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, ON
- 10 RECEIPT OF NOTICE DESCRIBED UNDER § 7-104(H) OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE
- 11 THAT AN INDIVIDUAL LICENSED IN THE STATE HAS BEEN CONVICTED OF A
- 12 VIOLATION UNDER § 7-104 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE FOR A FAILURE TO PAY
- 13 FOR MOTOR FUEL AFTER THE MOTOR FUEL WAS DISPENSED INTO A VEHICLE, THE
- 14 ADMINISTRATION:
- 15 (1) FOR A FIRST VIOLATION, MAY SUSPEND THE INDIVIDUAL'S LICENSE 16 FOR UP TO 30 DAYS; AND
- 17 (2) FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION, SHALL SUSPEND THE 18 INDIVIDUAL'S LICENSE FOR 30 DAYS.
- 19 (B) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 12, SUBTITLE 2 OF THIS ARTICLE,
- 20 A LICENSEE MAY REQUEST A HEARING ON A SUSPENSION UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 21 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 22 October 1, 2003.
