2 Vehicle Laws - Suspension of Driver's License - Theft of Motor Fuel

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing for a first offense, and requiring for a second or
- 4 subsequent offense, the Motor Vehicle Administration to suspend, for a certain
- 5 period of time, the driver's license of a person who is convicted of a theft offense
- 6 involving the failure to pay for motor fuel after the motor fuel was dispensed
- 7 into a vehicle; requiring a court to notify the Motor Vehicle Administration of
- 8 certain violations involving the theft of motor fuel; requiring a court to notify a
- 9 person who is convicted of a certain theft offense that the person's driver's
- 10 license may be suspended; requiring the Chief Judge of the District Court and
- the Administrative Office of the Courts, in conjunction with the Motor Vehicle
- 12 Administration, to establish certain procedures; providing for a certain hearing
- on the request of a licensee under certain circumstances; and generally relating
- to the suspension of the driver's license of a person who is convicted of a theft
- offense involving the failure to pay for motor fuel after the motor fuel was

	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section(s) 7-104(h) of Article - Criminal Law of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7-104(i).

21 22	(a) A person may not willfully or knowingly obtain or exert unauthorized control over property, if the person:
23	(1) intends to deprive the owner of the property;
24 25	(2) willfully or knowingly uses, conceals, or abandons the property in manner that deprives the owner of the property; or
26 27	(3) uses, conceals, or abandons the property knowing the use, concealment, or abandonment probably will deprive the owner of the property.
28 29	(b) A person may not obtain control over property by willfully or knowingly using deception, if the person:
30	(1) intends to deprive the owner of the property;
31 32	(2) willfully or knowingly uses, conceals, or abandons the property in manner that deprives the owner of the property; or
33 34	(3) uses, conceals, or abandons the property knowing the use, concealment, or abandonment probably will deprive the owner of the property.

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- 1 (H) (1) IF A PERSON IS CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION UNDER THIS SECTION
 2 FOR FAILURE TO PAY FOR MOTOR FUEL AFTER THE MOTOR FUEL WAS DISPENSED
 3 INTO A VEHICLE, THE COURT SHALL:
 4 (I) NOTIFY THE PERSON THAT THE PERSON'S DRIVER'S LICENSE
- 5 MAY BE SUSPENDED UNDER § 16-206.1 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE; AND
- 6 (II) NOTIFY THE MOTOR VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION OF THE 7 VIOLATION.
- 8 (2) THE CHIEF JUDGE OF THE DISTRICT COURT AND THE 9 ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MOTOR 10 VEHICLE ADMINISTRATION, SHALL ESTABLISH UNIFORM PROCEDURES FOR
- 11 REPORTING A VIOLATION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.

- 14 (A) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, ON
- 15 RECEIPT OF NOTICE DESCRIBED UNDER § 7-104(H) OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE
- 16 THAT AN INDIVIDUAL LICENSED IN THE STATE HAS BEEN CONVICTED OF A
- 17 VIOLATION UNDER § 7-104 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE FOR A FAILURE TO PAY
- 18 FOR MOTOR FUEL AFTER THE MOTOR FUEL WAS DISPENSED INTO A VEHICLE, THE
- 19 ADMINISTRATION:
- 20 (1) FOR A FIRST VIOLATION, MAY SUSPEND THE INDIVIDUAL'S LICENSE 21 FOR UP TO 30 DAYS; AND
- 22 (2) FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION, SHALL SUSPEND THE 23 INDIVIDUAL'S LICENSE FOR 30 DAYS.
- 24 (B) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 12, SUBTITLE 2 OF THIS ARTICLE,
- 25 A LICENSEE MAY REQUEST A HEARING ON A SUSPENSION UNDER THIS SECTION.
