- 22 THE INITIAL TIME PERIODS FOR FILING A FINAL REPORT AND FOR (A)
- 23 MAKING DISTRIBUTION TO EACH LEGATEE AND HEIR ARE EXTENDED FOR 90 DAYS
- 24 ON A CONSENT FOR EXTENSION OF THE TIME PERIODS SIGNED BY THE PERSONAL
- 25 REPRESENTATIVE AND EACH INTERESTED PERSON AND FILED WITHIN 10 MONTHS
- 26 FROM THE DATE OF APPOINTMENT.
- 27 A register of wills or a court may not extend the time periods established (B)
