- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 26 THE SECRETARY SHALL ESTABLISH AND PROMOTE THE ORAL HEALTH

- 4 (A) IN CONSULTATION WITH DENTAL CARE PROVIDERS, THE SECRETARY

- 26 Health Advisory Committee appointed by the Secretary shall recommend to the
- 27 Secretary the best methods to promote and implement a strategy to decrease oral
- 28 cancer mortality and to implement the provisions of this Act.
- 29 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 30 effect October 1, 2003.
