TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM, AN INDIVIDUAL SHALL HAVE AN 26 (F) 27 ANNUAL GROSS INCOME OF NO GREATER THAN 300% OF THE FEDERAL POVERTY 28 GUIDELINES. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1, 2004, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall submit to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services of the United States Department of Health and Human Services an application to amend the State's existing Medical Assistance Program so as to implement the Employed Persons with Disabilities Program.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, within 5 days after receipt of approval or denial by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services of the application for the Employed Persons with Disabilities Program, shall forward a copy of the approval or denial to the Department of Legislative Services, 90 State Circle, Annapolis, Maryland 21401.
