

**SENATE BILL 387** 1 Maryland Optometry Act selling and dispensing of contact lenses and replacement contact lenses. 2 3 BY adding to Article - Health - General 4 5 Section 24-301.1 Annotated Code of Maryland 6 7 (2000 Replacement Volume and 2002 Supplement) 8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article - Health Occupations 9 Section 11-101, 11-404.4, and 11-504 10 11 Annotated Code of Maryland 12 (2000 Replacement Volume and 2002 Supplement) 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 15 Article - Health - General 16 24-301.1. SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL 17 (A) 18 ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT GOVERN THE SELLING AND DISPENSING OF PLANO AND ZERO-POWERED CONTACT LENSES AND PLANO AND ZERO-POWERED REPLACEMENT 20 CONTACT LENSES. 21 A PERSON MAY NOT KNOWINGLY SELL OR DISPENSE CONTACT LENSES OR 22 REPLACEMENT CONTACT LENSES WITHOUT A VALID AND UNEXPIRED PRESCRIPTION 23 OR REPLACEMENT CONTACT LENS PRESCRIPTION. 24 A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF (C) 25 A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING 26 \$1,000. 27 THIS SECTION DOES NOT LIMIT THE RIGHT OF THE STATE BOARD OF (D) 28 EXAMINERS IN OPTOMETRY TO REGULATE AN OPTOMETRIST WHO KNOWINGLY 29 SELLS OR DISPENSES CONTACT LENSES OR REPLACEMENT CONTACT LENSES 30 WITHOUT A VALID AND UNEXPIRED PRESCRIPTION OR REPLACEMENT CONTACT

**Article - Health Occupations** 

In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

"Board" means the State Board of Examiners in Optometry.



"Replacement contact lens prescription" means a prescription prepared by a licensed optometrist containing the information specified in this section and written expressly for the purpose of providing lenses which have already been properly fitted.				
	(3) "Immediate follow-up care" is that period of contact lens fitting time required to reach a contact lens prescription that is appropriate to the documented clinical needs of the patient.			
8 (b) A licensed optometrist shall ensure that each replacement contact lens 9 prescription that the licensed optometrist prescribes for contact lenses:				
10 (1) Contains all the information necessary for the replacement contact 11 lens prescription to be properly dispensed, including but not limited to the:

	(c) (1) (i) After a licensed optometrist releases the patient from immediate follow-up care, the patient may request the replacement contact lens prescription from the licensed optometrist.			
30 paragraph (2) of this	(ii) If, after examination, the patient's prescription has not changed since the last examination, a licensed optometrist shall comply with the provisions of paragraph (2) of this subsection without requiring the patient to purchase contact lenses or to undergo immediate follow-up care.			
		Upon the request of a patient of a licensed optometrist, and e licensed optometrist shall provide the patient's cription to the patient or the patient's designee.		

1 In responding to a request under paragraph (1)(i) of this (ii) 2 subsection, a licensed optometrist shall transmit the contact lens prescription by 3 mail, telephone, facsimile, e-mail, or any other means of communication that will, 4 under normal circumstances, result in the designee receiving the information within 5 7 business days after the patient's request. 6 The replacement contact lens prescription that the licensed 7 optometrist provides the patient under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph: 8 Shall contain the information necessary for the proper 9 duplication of the current prescription of the patient; Shall contain, subject to the provisions of subsection (d) of 10 11 this section, an expiration date for the replacement contact lens prescription of not 12 more than 24 months from the time the patient was first examined; and 13 3. May contain wearing guidelines or specific instructions for 14 use of the contact lenses by the patient, or both. 15 The licensed optometrist shall enter into the patient's medical record the 16 valid clinical reasons for a shorter expiration date and shall provide the patient with a written and oral explanation of the clinical reasons for a shorter expiration date. 18 When a patient's CONTACT LENS prescription is dispensed by a person other than the licensed optometrist or a person associated directly or indirectly with 19 the licensed optometrist, the licensed optometrist is not liable for any injury to or condition of a patient caused solely by the negligence of the dispenser. A licensed optometrist who releases a replacement contact lens 22 prescription to a patient may provide the patient with a written statement that 24 wearing improperly fitted contact lenses may cause harm to the patient's eyes and 25 that the patient should have an eye examination if there are any changes in the 26 patient's vision, including pain or vision loss. 27 A licensed optometrist who fills or provides a contact lens prescription shall maintain a record of that prescription in accordance with § 4-403 of the Health - General Article. A person other than a licensed optometrist who fills a contact lens 30 31 prescription shall maintain a record of that prescription for 5 years. The Board may impose a civil fine of no more than \$1,000 on a licensed 32 33 optometrist who fails to provide a replacement contact lens prescription or who 34 knowingly dispenses contact lenses without a valid and unexpired replacement 35 contact lens prescription, or who otherwise fails to comply with this title.

- 2 (a) [Knowingly selling] SELLING or dispensing CONTACT LENSES OR
- 3 replacement contact lenses without a valid and unexpired PRESCRIPTION OR
- 4 replacement contact lens prescription shall be considered a violation of this title.
- 5 (b) The Board shall investigate any alleged violation of this section or §
- 6 11-404.4 of this title and may, notwithstanding § 11-205 of this title:
- 7 (1) Issue subpoenas, administer oaths, and examine witnesses; and
- 8 (2) Enforce any provision of this title by injunction or other appropriate
- 9 proceedings.
- 10 (c) An action under this section is in addition to and not instead of criminal 11 prosecution under § 11-505 of this subtitle.
- 12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the provisions of this Act
- 13 may not be construed to affect, alter, or modify in any way, the decision in, or results
- 14 of, Board of Examiners in Optometry, et al v. Richard Spitz, Jr., 300 Md. 466 (1984).
- 15 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 16 October 1, 2003.
