SENATE BILL 405

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 (a) (1) A person may not drive or attempt to drive any vehicle while under 6 the influence of alcohol.

7 (2) A person may not drive or attempt to drive any vehicle while the 8 person is under the influence of alcohol per se.

9 (b) A person may not drive or attempt to drive any vehicle while impaired by 10 alcohol.

11 (c) (1) A person may not drive or attempt to drive any vehicle while he is so
12 far impaired by any drug, any combination of drugs, or a combination of one or more
