13 14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
15	Article - State Finance and Procurement
16	14-405.
17	(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
18 19	(2) (i) "Recycled materials" means material recovered from or otherwise destined for the waste stream.
	(ii) "Recycled materials" includes post-consumer material, industrial scrap material, compost, PROCESSED AND PASTEURIZED CHICKEN LITTER, and obsolete inventories.
25	(3) "Percentage price preference" means the percent by which a responsive bid from a responsible bidder whose product contains recycled materials may exceed the lowest responsive bid submitted by a responsible bidder whose products do not contain recycled materials.

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1 (b) No later than January 1, 1994, the Board shall adopt regulations that

2 require the Secretary of General Services, the Secretary of Transportation, and the

3 Chancellor of the University System of Maryland to establish a percentage price

4 preference, not to exceed 5%, for the purchase of products made from recycled

5 materials.

6 (c) A percentage price preference under this section may not be used in 7 conjunction with any other percentage price preference established under this title.

8 (d) (1) To encourage the maximum purchase of commodities utilizing 9 recycled materials, the Department of General Services, in consultation with the

10 Department of the Environment, the University of Maryland, the Maryland

11 Environmental Service, the Department of Transportation, the Department of

12 Natural Resources, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, and as necessary

13 with representatives of the recycling industry and environmental organizations, shall

14 establish a list of acceptable products which contain recycled materials.

15(2)The list shall be published for use by State agencies at least twice16 each year.

17 (e) By January 1, 1991, each State unit shall review the procurement 18 specifications currently used by the unit and, to the extent practicable, require the 19 use of a percentage price preference in their purchase of supplies and commodities 20 containing recycled materials.

21 (f) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, this section is
22 broadly applicable to all procurements by the State if the quality of the product is
23 consistent with the requirements of the bid specifications.

24 (2) Only to the extent necessary to prevent the denial of federal moneys 25 or eliminate the inconsistency with federal law, this section does not apply to a 26 procurement by the State if the procurement officer determines that compliance with 27 the product of the section of the section does not apply to a

27 this section would:

28 (i) cause denial of federal moneys; or

29 (ii) be inconsistent with the requirements of federal law.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 31 June 1, 2003.

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
