CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Disease Prevention - Hepatitis C Advisory Council**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a State Advisory Council on Hepatitis C to ~~provide~~
4 ~~advice and recommendations to the General Assembly on public awareness,~~
5 ~~education, screening, and treatment related to hepatitis C~~ review, recommend
6 changes to, and solicit funds to implement a certain hepatitis C prevention plan;
7 specifying the membership, terms, removal, chairman, and purpose of the
8 Advisory Council; requiring the Advisory Council to issue certain reports on or
9 before certain dates; requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to
10 take certain actions in connection with the Hepatitis C Advisory Council;
11 defining certain terms; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally
12 relating to the Hepatitis C Advisory Council.

5 Preamble

6 WHEREAS, Hepatitis C is a silent killer, being largely asymptomatic until
7 irreversible liver damage may have occurred; and

8 WHEREAS, Hepatitis C has been characterized by the World Health
9 Organization as a disease of primary concern to humanity; and

10 WHEREAS, Hepatitis C currently infects approximately 4.5 million persons in
11 the United States, and each year there are some 30,000 new infections nationwide;
12 and

13 WHEREAS, The federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimate
14 that approximately 12,000 persons die annually from the consequences of hepatitis C,
15 and this number continues to grow each year; and

16 WHEREAS, The disease is considered to be such a public health threat that the
17 United States Department of Health and Human Services has initiated a
18 comprehensive plan to address this significant health problem, beginning with the
19 identification of, and notification to, hundreds of thousands of persons who are
20 inadvertently exposed to hepatitis C through blood transfusions; and

21 WHEREAS, In the absence of a vaccine for hepatitis C, emphasis must be placed
22 on other means of awareness and prevention of this disease, including, but not limited
23 to, education of persons at high risk for hepatitis C as defined by the federal Centers
24 for Disease Control and Prevention, as well as police officers, firefighters, health care
25 workers, and the general public; and

26 WHEREAS, Educating the public and health care community throughout the
27 State about hepatitis C will ensure an optimal approach to controlling this lethal
28 disease; now, therefore,

29 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
30 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE;

16 (III) ONE SHALL BE THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND MENTAL
17 HYGIENE OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

18 (IV) ONE SHALL BE THE SECRETARY OF VETERANS AFFAIRS OR THE
19 SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

4 ~~(VII)~~ (IX) ONE SHALL BE A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE AMERICAN
5 LIVER FOUNDATION; AND

6 ~~(VIII)~~ (X) ONE SHALL BE A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE BALTIMORE
7 CITY HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

8 (B) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER IS 2 YEARS.

9 (2) AT THE END OF A TERM A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A
10 SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.

11 (3) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES
12 ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.

13 (C) THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE A MEMBER OF THE ADVISORY BOARD FOR
14 INCOMPETENCE OR MISCONDUCT.

16 FROM AMONG THE MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY COUNCIL THE GOVERNOR
17 SHALL APPOINT A CHAIRMAN.

19 (A) A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS SERVING ON THE ADVISORY COUNCIL
20 REPRESENTS A QUORUM TO CONDUCT BUSINESS.

21 (B) A MEMBER OF THE ADVISORY COUNCIL:

22 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION; BUT

23 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE

3 THE PURPOSE OF THE ADVISORY COUNCIL SHALL BE TO:

4 (1) REVIEW AND RECOMMEND CHANGES TO THE "MARYLAND HEPATITIS
5 C PREVENTION AND CONTROL PLAN"; AND

6 (2) SOLICIT ANY FUNDS OR GRANTS FROM ANY FEDERAL, LOCAL,
7 PRIVATE, OR OTHER SOURCE TO IMPLEMENT "THE MARYLAND HEPATITIS C
8 PREVENTION AND CONTROL PLAN".

10 THE ADVISORY COUNCIL SHALL REPORT ON ITS ACTIVITIES AND
11 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF
12 THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON OR BEFORE
13 APRIL 1, 2005 AND ANNUALLY THEREAFTER AND INCLUDE ADVICE AND
14 RECOMMENDATIONS ON HEPATITIS C AS PROVIDED FOR IN THIS SUBTITLE.

16 THE SECRETARY SHALL DESIGNATE THE STAFF NECESSARY TO ASSIST THE
17 ADVISORY COUNCIL IN CARRYING OUT ITS FUNCTIONS AS PROVIDED UNDER THIS

20 (A) THE PROGRAM SHALL BE FUNDED AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

21 (B) THE FUNDING PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET FOR THE PROGRAM IS
22 INTENDED TO COMPLEMENT FUNDING RECEIVED FROM ANY OTHER LAWFUL
23 SOURCE.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
25 October 1, 2003. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of
26 September 30, 2005, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act
27 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
