- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 15 Article Education
- 16 15-106.3.
- 17 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS ARTICLE, AN INDIVIDUAL
- 18 OTHER THAN A NONIMMIGRANT ALIEN WITHIN THE MEANING OF TITLE 8, §
- 19 1101(A)(15) OF THE UNITED STATES CODE, SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM PAYING
- 20 NONRESIDENT TUITION AT A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IF THE
- 21 INDIVIDUAL:
- 22 (1) ATTENDED A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL IN THIS
- 23 STATE FOR AT LEAST 3 YEARS;
- 24 (2) GRADUATED FROM A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL IN
- 25 THIS STATE OR RECEIVED THE EQUIVALENT OF A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA IN THIS
- 26 STATE;
- 27 (3) REGISTERS AS AN ENTERING STUDENT IN A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF
- 28 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE NOT EARLIER THAN THE 2003 FALL SEMESTER;

- 1 (4) PROVIDES TO THE PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION AN
- 2 AFFIDAVIT STATING THAT THE INDIVIDUAL WILL FILE AN APPLICATION TO BECOME
- 3 A PERMANENT RESIDENT WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE INDIVIDUAL BECOMES
- 4 ELIGIBLE TO DO SO; AND
- 5 (5) MAKES APPLICATION TO ATTEND A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER
- 6 EDUCATION IN THIS STATE NOT LATER THAN 5 YEARS AFTER GRADUATING FROM A
- 7 PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL IN THIS STATE OR RECEIVING THE
- 8 EQUIVALENT OF A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA IN THIS STATE.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 July 1, 2003.
