1 AN ACT concerning

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Higher Education - Resident Tuition Charges - Immigrant Students

3 FOR the purpose of establishing that certain individuals, other than certain

- 4 nonresident aliens, shall be exempt from paying nonresident tuition at certain
- 5 public institutions of higher education under certain circumstances; prohibiting
- 6 certain institutions of higher education from awarding degrees to certain
- 7 individuals under certain circumstances; requiring the Maryland Higher
- 8 Education Commission to adopt certain regulations; and generally relating to
- 9 tuition charges for certain individuals attending public institutions of higher
- 10 education in the State.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Education

19 15-106.3.

(A) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS ARTICLE, AN INDIVIDUAL OTHER THAN A NONIMMIGRANT ALIEN WITHIN THE MEANING OF TITLE 8, § 1101(A)(15) OF THE UNITED STATES CODE, SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM PAYING

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NONRESIDENT TUITION AT A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IF THE
 INDIVIDUAL:

3 (1) ATTENDED A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL IN THIS 4 STATE FOR AT LEAST 3 YEARS;

5 (2) GRADUATED FROM A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL IN 6 THIS STATE OR RECEIVED THE EQUIVALENT OF A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA IN THIS 7 STATE;

8 (3) REGISTERS AS AN ENTERING STUDENT IN A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF 9 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE NOT EARLIER THAN THE 2003 FALL SEMESTER;

(4) PROVIDES TO THE PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION AN
 AFFIDAVIT STATING THAT THE INDIVIDUAL WILL FILE AN APPLICATION TO BECOME
 A PERMANENT RESIDENT WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE INDIVIDUAL BECOMES
 ELIGIBLE TO DO SO; AND

14 (5) MAKES APPLICATION TO ATTEND A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER
15 EDUCATION IN THIS STATE NOT LATER THAN 5 YEARS AFTER GRADUATING FROM A
16 PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL IN THIS STATE OR RECEIVING THE
17 EQUIVALENT OF A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA IN THIS STATE.

18 (B) <u>A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION MAY NOT AWARD A</u>
 19 <u>DEGREE TO AN INDIVIDUAL WHO QUALIFIES FOR RESIDENT TUITION CHARGES</u>
 20 <u>UNDER THIS SECTION UNTIL:</u>

23 (2) PAYS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE TUITION CHARGES FOR A
 24 NONRESIDENT STUDENT AND THE TUITION CHARGES FOR A RESIDENT STUDENT AT
 25 THE INSTITUTION.

26 (C) <u>THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH</u>
 27 <u>TITLE 10, SUBTITLE 1 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE TO IMPLEMENT THE</u>
 28 <u>PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.</u>

29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 30 July 1, 2003.

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
