4 FOR the purpose of requiring a county governing body to consider certain guidelines

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (e) (1) (i) Within 30 days after the receipt of an application to sell, the
- 21 Foundation shall notify the governing body of the county containing the subject land,
- 22 that an application to sell has been received.

1 1. Within 60 days of the notification, the county governing (ii) 2 body shall advise the Foundation as to local approval or disapproval of the 3 application. The Foundation shall grant a 30-day extension of this response period if 4 the county governing body applies to the Foundation for an extension and states its 5 reasons for seeking an extension. Upon local approval of the application, the county 6 2. governing body shall submit a statement of the total current development rights on 7 8 the subject land to the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation, along 9 with the application approval notification. 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1(3)(4)In making its recommendation, the county agricultural2preservation advisory board shall:

3 (i) Take into consideration criteria and standards established by

4 the Foundation under this subtitle, current local regulations, local patterns of land

5 development, the kinds of pressures to develop the subject land, State smart growth6 goals, and any locally established priorities for the preservation of agricultural land;7 and

8 (ii) Recommend for ranking any application that qualifies and 9 meets the priorities established by the county governing body for the preservation of 10 agricultural land.

11(4)(5)The county agricultural preservation advisory board shall12provide a public hearing concerning any application to sell if such a hearing is13requested by a majority of the county agricultural preservation advisory board, or by

14 a majority of the county governing body, or by the applicant.

15 (5) (6) The board of trustees of the Foundation shall not approve any
16 application to sell which has not been approved by the governing body of the county
17 containing the subject land.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect19 October 1, 2003.

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
