BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 12 **Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings** 13 8-209. 14 (a) The only persons exempt from jury service are: A member of the organized militia who is certified by the military (1) 16 department as a member; [and] A PERSON WHOSE RELIGIOUS BELIEFS PROHIBIT THE PERSON FROM (2)18 SERVING ON A JURY; AND 19 A person who is 70 years old or older who has made a written [(2)](3) 20 request to the jury commissioner or clerk for an exemption. Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, in any 3 year period, a 21 22 person may not be required to: 23 Serve or attend court for prospective service as a petit juror for more (1) 24 than one term of court, except when necessary to complete service in a particular

- 2 (3) Serve as both a grand and petit juror.
- As to any juror who has actually served on a petit jury for less than 5 days, 3 (c)
- 4 the 3 year limitation on frequency of jury service provided by subsection (b) of this
- 5 section may be reduced to not less than 1 year by appropriate provision in a juror 6 selection plan adopted under § 8-201 of this article.
