16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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## **Article - Business Occupations and Professions**

- 3 (A) A LICENSED OR CERTIFIED REAL ESTATE APPRAISER SHALL FILE WITH

- 9 (B) THE REPORT SHALL BE OPEN FOR INSPECTION ONLY TO
- 10 REPRESENTATIVES OF GOVERNMENT AGENCIES FOR INVESTIGATION OF
- 11 FRAUDULENT PRACTICES.
- 12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 13 General Assembly that funding be provided in the State budget for an investigator, an
- 14 administrative assistant, and any necessary increase in computer capacity to
- 15 accommodate the quarterly reporting requirements the Baltimore City Department of
- 16 Housing and Community Development shall serve as the designee of the State
- 17 Commission of Real Estate Appraisers and Home Inspectors and shall receive and
- 18 maintain the reports filed under § 16-212.1 of the Business Occupations and
- 19 Professions Article as enacted by Section 1 of this Act until such time as funding is
- 20 made available to the Commission to establish an electronic database capable of
- 21 storing the reports and to hire staff to maintain the database.
