State Board of Examiners for Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dispensers, and Speech-Language Pathologists - Membership and Scope of Authority	
FOR the purpose of specifying that provisions of law regulating audiologists, hearing aid dispensers, and speech-language pathologists do not limit the right of a physician to dispense hearing aids; decreasing the number of Board members to a certain number; providing for the termination of the term of office of certain board members; and generally relating to the composition and scope of authority of the State Board of Examiners for Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dispensers, and Speech-Language Pathologists.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 1 **Article - Health Occupations** 2 2-102. 3 This title does not: Limit the right of an individual to practice a health occupation that 4 (1) the individual is authorized to practice under this article; Prohibit an individual from practicing any other profession that the 6 (2) individual is authorized to practice under the laws of this State; or 7 (3) Limit the right of a physician who is authorized to practice medicine 9 under the laws of the State to treat the human ear or TO fit OR TO DISPENSE hearing 10 aids. 11 2-202. 12 The Board consists of [13] 11 members. (a) (1) 13 (2)Of the [13] 11 Board members: 14 3 shall be licensed audiologists who have at least 5 years' paid work experience in audiology; 15 3 shall be licensed speech-language pathologists who have at 16 (ii) 17 least 5 years' paid work experience in speech-language pathology; 18 [(iii) 2 shall be physicians who: 19 1. Are licensed to practice medicine in this State; and 20 2. Hold a certificate of qualification from the American 21 Board of Otolaryngology;] 22 2 shall be consumer members, 1 of whom shall be hearing [(iv)](III)23 impaired; and 3 shall be licensed hearing aid dispensers who have at 24 [(v)](IV) 25 least 5 years' paid work experience in dispensing hearing aids. The Governor shall appoint the physician members, with the advice 26 27 of the Secretary, from a list submitted to the Secretary and the Governor by the 28 Maryland Society of Otolaryngology with the approval of the Medical and Chirurgical 29 Faculty of the State of Maryland. There shall be at least 3 names on the list.] 30 The Governor shall appoint the speech-language pathologist 31 members, with the advice of the Secretary, from a list submitted to the Secretary and 32 the Governor by the Maryland Speech-Language and Hearing Association. The 33 number of names on the list shall be at least 3 times the number of vacancies.

3 4	[(5)] (4) (i) Subject to subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the Governor shall appoint the audiologist members, with the advice of the Secretary, from a list submitted to the Secretary and the Governor, jointly by the Maryland Academy of Audiology and the Maryland Speech-Language and Hearing Association. The number of names on the list shall be at least 3 times the number of vacancies.
6 7	(ii) For each audiologist vacancy, the Maryland Academy of Audiology and the Maryland Speech-Language and Hearing Association shall:
8 9	1. Notify by mail all licensed audiologists in the State of the vacancy to solicit nominations to fill the vacancy; and
	2. Conduct a balloting process by mail by which every licensed audiologist in the State is eligible to vote on the names of the licensed audiologists to be submitted to the Secretary and the Governor.
15 16	[(6)] (5) The Governor shall appoint the hearing aid dispenser members, with the advice of the Secretary, from a list submitted to the Secretary and the Governor by the Maryland members of the Hearing Aid Specialist Association of Maryland, District of Columbia, and Delaware. The number of names on the list shall be at least 3 times the number of vacancies.
18 19	[(7)] (6) (i) The Governor shall appoint the consumer members with the advice of the Secretary and the advice and consent of the Senate.
	(ii) 1. The Governor shall appoint the hearing impaired consumer member from a list submitted to the Secretary and the Governor by the Governor's Office for Individuals with Disabilities.
23 24	2. The Governor's Office for Individuals with Disabilities shall solicit nominees from each of the hearing impaired associations in the State.
27 28	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of office of the members of the State Board of Examiners for Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dispensers, and Speech-Language Pathologists appointed under § 2-202(a)(2)(iii) of the Health Occupations Article, or their successors selected to fill a vacancy, who are in office as of September 30, 2003 shall terminate on October 1, 2003.
30 31	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2003.
