## **Architects - Continuing Education**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a licensee to complete certain continuing education

4 requirements for renewal of an architect's license; requiring an architect to

- 5 complete certain continuing education requirements for reinstatement of an
- 6 architect's license; providing for certain exceptions to meeting certain continuing
- 7 education requirements for renewal of an architect's license; establishing certain
- 8 criteria for approval by the State Board of Architects of a continuing education
- 9 course or activity; establishing certain criteria for accounting credit of a
- 10 continuing education course or activity; defining a certain term; and generally
- 11 relating to architects.

## 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 23 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Business Occupations and Professions

- 25 3-101.
- 26 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 27 (b) "Architect" means an individual who practices architecture.

1	(c)	"Board" means, unless the context requires otherwise, the State Board of
2 Ar	chitects.	

3 (d) "Code official" means a public official responsible for the review of building 4 permit documents or the issuance of building permits.

5 (E) "CONTACT HOUR" MEANS A MINIMUM OF 50 MINUTES OF ACTUAL CLASS 6 TIME FOR EACH 60-MINUTE HOUR.

7 [(e)] (F) "Design coordination" means the review and coordination of services 8 provided by individuals licensed or certified under Titles 3, 8, 9, 14, and 15 of this 9 article.

10 [(f)] (G) "License" means, unless the context requires otherwise, a license 11 issued by the Board to practice architecture.

12 [(g)] (H) "Licensed architect" means, unless the context requires otherwise, an 13 architect who is licensed by the Board to practice architecture.

[(h)] (I) "Permit" means, unless the context requires otherwise, a permit
issued by the Board to allow a partnership or corporation to operate a business
through which an individual may practice architecture.

17 [(i)] (J) (1) "Practice architecture" means to provide any service or creative 18 work:

19 (i) in regard to an addition to, alteration of, or construction of a 20 building or an integral part of a building; and

21 (ii) that requires education, training, and experience in 22 architecture.

23	(2)	"Practice architecture" includes:

24 (i) archite	ctural design and preparation of related documents;
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- 25 (ii) consultation;
- 26 (iii) design coordination;
- 27 (iv) evaluation;
- 28 (v) investigation; and

29 (vi) planning.

30 [(j)] (K) "Public use" means the use of a building or other structure for the 31 primary purpose of human use or habitation.

32 [(k)] (L) "Residential use" means the use of a building or other structure as a 33 dwelling.

(a) Unless a license is renewed for a 2-year term as provided in this section, the license expires on the first June 30 that comes:						
4 (1) after the effective date of the license; and						
5 (2) in an even-numbered year.						
6 (b) At least 1 month before a license expires, the Board shall mail to the 7 licensee, at the last known address of the licensee:						
8 (1) a renewal application form; and						
9 (2) a notice that states:						
10 (i) the date on which the current license expires;						
11 (ii) the date by which the Board must receive the renewal 12 application for the renewal to be issued and mailed before the license expires; and						
13 (iii) the amount of the renewal fee.						
14 (c) Before a license expires, the licensee periodically may renew it for an 15 additional 2-year term, if the licensee:						
16 (1) otherwise is entitled to be licensed;						
17(2)pays to the Board a renewal fee not exceeding \$70, as set by the18Board; [and]

24 (d) The Board shall renew the license of each licensee who meets the 25 requirements of this section.						
26 (e) An architect has a grace period of 30 days after the architect's license 27 expires in which to renew it retroactively, if the architect:						
28 (1) otherwise is entitled to have the license renewed; [and]						
29 (2) pays the renewal fee to the Board; AND						
30(3)MEETS THE CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT FOR RENEWAL31OF A LICENSE UNDER § 3-309.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE.						

1 (f) The Secretary may determine that licenses issued under this subtitle shall 2 expire on a staggered basis.

4 (A) (1) TO QUALIFY FOR RENEWAL OF A LICENSE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE, A
5 LICENSEE SHALL COMPLETE 12 CONTINUING EDUCATION CONTACT HOURS PER
6 12-MONTH PERIOD SINCE THE LAST RENEWAL OF A LICENSE, INCLUDING 8
7 CONTINUING EDUCATION CONTACT HOURS THAT ARE RELATED TO THE
8 PROTECTION OF THE HEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

9 (2) NOTWITHSTANDING PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION:

(I) A LICENSEE WHO IS GRANTED AN INITIAL LICENSE MAY
 RENEW A LICENSE FOR THE NEXT FULL TERM WITHOUT COMPLYING WITH THE
 CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT OF THIS SECTION;

(II) A LICENSEE SERVING ON TEMPORARY ACTIVE DUTY IN THE
ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES FOR A PERIOD OF TIME EXCEEDING 120
CONSECUTIVE DAYS IN A YEAR, IF THE ACTIVITY RESTRICTS PARTICIPATION IN A
CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAM, MAY RENEW A LICENSE FOR THE NEXT FULL
TERM WITHOUT COMPLYING WITH THE CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT OF
THIS SECTION; AND

(III) A LICENSEE EXPERIENCING PHYSICAL DISABILITY, ILLNESS,
 OR OTHER EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES AS REVIEWED AND APPROVED BY THE
 BOARD MAY RENEW A LICENSE FOR THE NEXT FULL TERM WITHOUT COMPLYING
 WITH THE CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT OF THIS SECTION.

23 (B) (1) A CONTINUING EDUCATION COURSE OR ACTIVITY MUST:

(I) HAVE A CLEAR PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVE WHICH WILL
MAINTAIN, IMPROVE, OR EXPAND SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE OBTAINED PRIOR TO
LICENSURE OR CERTIFICATION OR DEVELOP NEW AND RELEVANT SKILLS AND
KNOWLEDGE;

28 (II) BE PRESENTED IN A WELL-ORGANIZED AND SEQUENTIAL 29 MANNER;

30(III)PROVIDE EVIDENCE OF PREPLANNING WHICH MUST INCLUDE31THE OPPORTUNITY FOR INPUT BY THE GROUP TO BE SERVED;

32 (IV) BE CONDUCTED BY PERSONS WHO ARE WELL QUALIFIED
 33 BASED ON EDUCATION OR EXPERIENCE; AND

(V) PROVIDE FOR DOCUMENTATION OF AN INDIVIDUAL'S
 PARTICIPATION INCLUDING INFORMATION REQUIRED FOR RECORD KEEPING AND
 REPORTING.

1 A COURSE OR ACTIVITY APPROVED BY THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF (2)2 ARCHITECTS (AIA) AND THE NATIONAL COUNCIL OF ARCHITECTURAL REGISTRATION 3 BOARDS (NCARB) SHALL BE ACCEPTED AS MEETING THE REQUIREMENTS OF 4 PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION. A COURSE OR ACTIVITY NOT APPROVED BY THIS SUBSECTION, 5 (3)(I) 6 THE AIA, OR NCARB MAY BE GIVEN APPROVAL BY THE BOARD IF THE LICENSEE 7 SEEKING APPROVAL OF THE COURSE OR ACTIVITY SUBMITS A WRITTEN REQUEST TO 8 THE BOARD AND OBTAINS PRE-APPROVAL FROM THE BOARD. AN INDIVIDUAL SEEKING TO OBTAIN PRE-APPROVAL OF A 9 (II) 10 CONTINUING EDUCATION COURSE OR ACTIVITY SHALL SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING AT 11 LEAST 30 CALENDAR DAYS IN ADVANCE OF THE PROGRAM SO THAT THE BOARD MAY 12 ANALYZE AND RESPOND TO THE INDIVIDUAL: 13 1. THE NAME, ADDRESS, AND PHONE NUMBER OF THE 14 COURSE OR ACTIVITY SPONSOR; 15 THE NAME OF THE COURSE OR ACTIVITY; 2. A DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE COURSE OR ACTIVITY; 16 3. 17 THE LENGTH OF THE INSTRUCTIONAL PERIOD; 4. 18 5. THE TOTAL NUMBER OF CONTACT HOURS FOR WHICH **19 CREDIT IS SOUGHT:** 20 THE NAME AND ACADEMIC OR PROFESSIONAL 6. 21 CREDENTIALS OF THE COURSE OR ACTIVITY INSTRUCTOR; 22 7. THE TIME, PLACE, AND DATE OF THE COURSE OR 23 ACTIVITY; AND 8. THE SPONSOR'S METHOD FOR PROVIDING EVIDENCE OF 24 25 ATTENDANCE. 26 (III) THE SPONSOR OF A PRE-APPROVED COURSE OR ACTIVITY MAY 27 ANNOUNCE OR INDICATE AS FOLLOWS: "THIS COURSE HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE 28 MARYLAND STATE BOARD OF ARCHITECTS FOR THE MAXIMUM OF \_\_\_\_ CONTACT 29 HOURS OF CONTINUING EDUCATION." IN ACCOUNTING CREDIT, THE BOARD SHALL PROVIDE A SPACE ON 30 (C) (1)31 THE REGULAR LICENSE RENEWAL FORM FOR THE LICENSEE TO SIGN AS 32 CERTIFICATION THAT THE LICENSEE HAS COMPLIED WITH THE CONTINUING

33 EDUCATION REQUIREMENT OF THIS SECTION.

34 (2) THE BOARD MAY CONDUCT RANDOM AUDITS TO VERIFY
 35 COMPLETION OF THE REQUIREMENT.

(3) IN RESPONSE TO AN AUDIT, A LICENSEE MAY SUBMIT A TRANSCRIPT
 FROM THE CONTINUING EDUCATION SYSTEM OF THE AIA OR ANOTHER FORM
 PRESCRIBED OR ACCEPTED BY THE BOARD.

4 (4) EVIDENCE OF COMPLIANCE SHALL BE MAINTAINED BY THE 5 LICENSEE FOR 2 YEARS AFTER EACH RENEWAL PERIOD.

6 (5) IF AS A RESULT OF AN AUDIT THE BOARD DISALLOWS ANY CONTACT
7 HOURS, THE LICENSEE SHALL HAVE 6 MONTHS FROM NOTICE OF SUCH
8 DISALLOWANCE EITHER TO PROVIDE ACCEPTABLE EVIDENCE OF HAVING ACQUIRED
9 CONTACT HOURS OR TO ACQUIRE THE REQUIRED NUMBER OF CONTACT HOURS
10 PRIOR TO REVOCATION OF A LICENSE.

(D) THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION MAY BE MET IF AN INDIVIDUAL IS
LICENSED OR CERTIFIED IN ANOTHER STATE, PROVINCE, OR DISTRICT WHICH HAS A
CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT FOR RENEWAL OF A LICENSE THAT IS
SIMILAR TO THE PROGRAM IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, AND THE PROGRAM
IS ACCEPTED BY THE BOARD AND THE INDIVIDUAL CERTIFIES THAT ALL
CONTINUING EDUCATION AND LICENSING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE STATE,
PROVINCE, OR DISTRICT FROM WHICH THE INDIVIDUAL IS LICENSED OR CERTIFIED
HAVE BEEN MET, SUBJECT TO AUDIT BY THE BOARD.

19 (E) THE BOARD MAY WAIVE THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION FOR A
20 LICENSEE IF THE LICENSEE SHOWS GOOD CAUSE FOR BEING UNABLE TO MEET THE
21 REQUIREMENTS.

22 3-310.

(a) The Board shall reinstate the license of an architect who, for any reason,has failed to renew the license by the end of the 30-day grace period if the architect:

25 (1) meets the renewal requirements of § 3-309 of this subtitle;

26 (2) pays to the Board all past due renewal fees;

27 (3) except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of this section, pays to 28 the Board a reinstatement fee of \$100, in addition to all past due renewal fees; [and]

29 (4) submits to the Board a reinstatement application on the form that30 the Board provides; AND

(5) MEETS THE CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT THAT WOULD
 HAVE BEEN REQUIRED FOR RENEWAL OF A LICENSE UNDER § 3-309.1 OF THIS
 SUBTITLE, IF THE LICENSE HAD NOT EXPIRED, UP TO A MAXIMUM OF 24 CONTACT
 HOURS.

35 (b) The Board may waive a reinstatement fee for a licensee who provides

36 evidence satisfactory to the Board that the licensee did not practice architecture

37 during the time the license lapsed.

- 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 2 effect October 1, 2003.
