A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Education - Elementary Schools - Moratorium on Suspensions of Students

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting an elementary school principal from suspending any

- 4 student under the principal's direction for a certain period of time starting on a
- 5 certain date; requiring the county boards of education to develop and implement
- 6 certain disciplinary measures by a certain date; requiring the county boards to
- 7 submit a certain report to the State Department of Education by certain dates
- 8 each year; requiring the State Board to submit a certain report to certain
- 9 committees on or before certain dates each year; providing for the termination of
- 10 this Act; and generally relating to a moratorium on suspensions of elementary
- 11 school students.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Education

20 7-305.2.

(A) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF § 7-305 OF THIS SUBTITLE, A
PRINCIPAL OF A PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL MAY NOT SUSPEND ANY STUDENT IN
THE SCHOOL WHO IS UNDER THE DIRECTION OF THE PRINCIPAL FOR A PERIOD OF 2
YEARS BEGINNING THE FALL SEMESTER OF THE 2003 SCHOOL YEAR.

(B) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT ALTERNATE
IN-SCHOOL DISCIPLINARY MEASURES FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS THAT
INCLUDE COMMUNICATION WITH PARENTS AND ANY OTHER APPROPRIATE
COMMUNITY AGENCIES, BY THE FIRST DAY OF THE FALL SEMESTER OF THE 2003
SCHOOL YEAR.

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(C) BY DECEMBER 1 AND MAY 1 OF EACH YEAR, EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL
 SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT THAT INCLUDES A DESCRIPTION OF THE
 ALTERNATE IN-SCHOOL DISCIPLINARY MEASURES ADOPTED AND IMPLEMENTED.

4 (D) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT CONSISTING OF A
5 COMPILATION OF THE REPORTS SUBMITTED BY COUNTY BOARDS TO THE
6 DEPARTMENT UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF
7 THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE SENATE EDUCATION, HEALTH, AND
8 ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE AND THE HOUSE WAYS AND MEANS
9 COMMITTEE ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1 AND JUNE 1 OF EACH YEAR.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take

11 effect July 1, 2003. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of

12 June 30, 2005, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall

13 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
