9 Preamble

- WHEREAS, The General Assembly found in 2000 that maternal deaths were a
- 11 serious public health concern that had a tremendous family and societal impact and
- 12 that maternal deaths were significantly underestimated and inadequately
- 13 documented, preventing efforts to identify and reduce or eliminate the causes of
- 14 death; and
- WHEREAS, The General Assembly also found in 2000 that the State did not
- 16 have a process for the confidential identification, investigation, or dissemination of
- 17 findings regarding maternal deaths and found a need to establish a maternal
- 18 mortality review program to review maternal deaths and to develop strategies for the
- 19 prevention of maternal deaths; and
- 20 WHEREAS, The General Assembly of Maryland enacted the Maternal Mortality
- 21 Review Program on April 25, 2000; and
- WHEREAS, The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene established the
- 23 Program to review maternal deaths and to develop strategies for the prevention of
- 24 maternal deaths in Maryland; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The Program has successfully fulfilled its objectives; and
- WHEREAS, Maternal deaths are still a serious public health concern, however,
- 27 and there is still a need for the Program to continue in existence in order to review

- 1 maternal deaths and develop strategies for the prevention of maternal deaths; now,
- 2 therefore,
- 3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 4 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 Chapter 74 of the Acts of 2000

- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 7 October 1, 2000. [It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of
- 8 September 30, 2003, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
- 9 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.]
- 10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 11 June 1, 2003.
