# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## **Allegany County - Paper Gaming - Regulation**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing in Allegany County a licensing procedure for certain

4 profit businesses and qualified organizations to engage in paper gaming and for

5 persons to sell paper gaming devices to paper gaming licensees; establishing

6 certain licensing requirements; exempting certain organizations from a certain

7 licensing requirement; requiring the Board of License Commissioners to set

8 certain annual fees under certain circumstances; requiring wholesale vendor

9 licensees to report certain information at certain times to the Board of License

10 Commissioners; requiring certain retail alcoholic beverages licensees to obtain

11 and display certain stamps; requiring the Board of License Commissioners to

12 ensure that a certain procedure regarding the sale of paper gaming devices is

13 followed; authorizing the Board of License Commissioners to suspend or revoke

14 certain licenses under certain circumstances; authorizing the Board of County

15 Commissioners to impose certain taxes; establishing a Special Gaming Fund;

16 specifying the nature, use, and contents of the Fund; requiring that the Board of

17 County Commissioners annually make certain payments and allocations from

18 the Fund; defining certain terms; and generally relating to paper gaming in

19 Allegany County.

(3) QUALIFIED ORGANIZATIONS THAT DO NOT HAVE AN ALCOHOLIC

 3 GAMING WITHOUT OBTAINING A PAPER GAMING LICENSE.

4 (D) A PERSON MAY SELL PAPER GAMING DEVICES TO A PAPER GAMING
5 LICENSEE IF THE PERSON OBTAINS A WHOLESALE VENDOR'S LICENSE ISSUED BY
6 THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE BOARD OF
7 COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

8 (E) THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS SHALL SET ANNUAL FEES FOR A 9 PAPER GAMING LICENSE AND A WHOLESALE VENDOR'S LICENSE.

10 (F) QUARTERLY, WHOLESALE VENDOR LICENSEES SHALL PROVIDE A LIST TO
11 THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS OF ALL CUSTOMERS TO WHOM THEY SELL
12 PAPER GAMING PRODUCTS AND THE TOTAL NUMBER OF PRODUCTS SOLD TO EACH
13 CUSTOMER.

14 (G) A RETAIL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES LICENSEE WHO HOLDS A PAPER
15 GAMING LICENSE SHALL OBTAIN WITHOUT CHARGE FROM THE BOARD OF LICENSE
16 COMMISSIONERS A STAMP TO BE DISPLAYED WITH THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES
17 LICENSE.

18 (H) THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS SHALL ENSURE THAT EACH
19 RETAIL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES LICENSEE WHO HOLDS A PAPER GAMING LICENSE
20 SELLS TO THE PUBLIC THE SAME SERIAL-NUMBERED PAPER GAMING DEVICES THAT
21 ARE LISTED ON THE BILL OF SALE FROM THE WHOLESALE VENDOR LICENSEE.

(I) AFTER A HEARING, IF THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS FINDS
THAT A PAPER GAMING LICENSEE, A WHOLESALE VENDOR LICENSEE, OR AN AGENT
OF A LICENSEE HAS VIOLATED THIS SECTION, THE BOARD OF LICENSE
COMMISSIONERS MAY REVOKE OR SUSPEND THE LICENSE.
