SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 24 25 effect June July 1, 2003. It shall remain in effect through December 2003 effective for 26 a period of 1 year and, at the end of December 31, 2003 June 30, 2004, without the 27 necessity of further action with no further action required by the General Assembly,

28 this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
