FOR the purpose of establishing a Study Panel on the Availability of Audiology and Speech and Language Speech-Language Services for children in public school programs; establishing the membership of the Study Panel and its duties; providing for the staff of the Study Panel; requiring the Study Panel to report its findings and recommendations to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the study of the availability of audiology and speech and language speech-language services in the public schools of the State.
