FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Maryland Health Care Commission from granting a person that operates a hospice care program a statewide certificate of need or authority to operate the hospice care program statewide through a Commission ruling or determination; requiring the Commission to review certain rulings and determinations for a certain purpose providing that a person may only operate a general hospice care program under certain conditions; restricting the jurisdictions in which a purchaser of a general hospice may provide home-based	
 hospice services; prohibiting the Maryland Health Care Commission from issuing a certificate of need or a determination pursuant to an acquisition under 	
certain circumstances; requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, in
