SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 Article - State Government 2 10-618. 3 (a) Unless otherwise provided by law, if a custodian believes that inspection of 4 a part of a public record by the applicant would be contrary to the public interest, the custodian may deny inspection by the applicant of that part, as provided in this 6 section. 7 Subject to paragraph (2) PARAGRAPHS (2), (3), AND (4) of this (i) subsection, a custodian may deny inspection of: 9 (i) response procedures or plans prepared to prevent or respond to 10 emergency situations, the disclosure of which would reveal vulnerability assessments, specific tactics, specific emergency procedures, or specific security procedures; 12 (ii) 1. building plans, blueprints, schematic drawings, diagrams, 13 operational manuals, or other records of airports and other mass transit facilities, 14 bridges, tunnels, emergency response facilities or structures, buildings where 15 hazardous materials are stored, arenas, stadiums, and waste and water systems, AND 16 ANY OTHER BUILDING, STRUCTURE, OR FACILITY, the disclosure of which would 17 reveal the building's [or], structure's OR FACILITY'S internal layout, specific location, 18 life, safety, and support systems, structural elements, surveillance techniques, alarm 19 or security systems or technologies, operational and transportation plans or protocols, 20 or personnel deployments; or 2. records of any other building [or], structure, OR FACILITY 22 [owned or operated by the State or any of its political subdivisions], the disclosure of 23 which would reveal the building's [or], structure's, OR FACILITY'S life, safety, and 24 support systems, surveillance techniques, alarm or security systems or technologies, 25 operational and evacuation plans or protocols, or personnel deployments; or 26 records prepared to prevent or respond to emergency situations 27 identifying or describing the name, location, pharmaceutical cache, contents, capacity, equipment, physical features, or capabilities of individual medical facilities, storage facilities, or laboratories [established, maintained, or regulated by the State or any of 30 its political subdivisions]. 31 The custodian may deny inspection of a part of a public record under 32 paragraph (1) of this subsection only to the extent that the inspection would: 33 jeopardize the security of any BUILDING, structure, OR 34 FACILITY [owned or operated by the State or any of its political subdivisions]; 35 (ii) facilitate the planning of a terrorist attack; or endanger the life or physical safety of an individual. 36 (iii) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, A 37

38 CUSTODIAN MAY NOT DENY INSPECTION OF A PUBLIC RECORD UNDER PARAGRAPH

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- 1 (1) OR (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION THAT RELATES TO A BUILDING, STRUCTURE, OR
- 2 FACILITY THAT HAS BEEN SUBJECTED TO A CATASTROPHIC EVENT, INCLUDING TO A

- 4 (II) THIS PARAGRAPH DOES NOT APPLY TO THE RECORDS OF ANY
- 5 BUILDING, STRUCTURE, OR FACILITY OWNED OR OPERATED BY THE STATE OR ANY
- 6 OF ITS POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS.
- 7 (4) (I) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPHS (1) AND (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION AND
- 8 SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, A CUSTODIAN MAY NOT DENY INSPECTION
- 9 OF A PUBLIC RECORD THAT RELATES TO AN INSPECTION OF OR ISSUANCE OF A
- 10 CITATION CONCERNING A BUILDING, STRUCTURE, OR FACILITY BY AN AGENCY OF
- 11 THE STATE OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION.
- 12 (II) THIS PARAGRAPH DOES NOT APPLY TO THE RECORDS OF ANY
- 13 BUILDING, STRUCTURE, OR FACILITY OWNED OR OPERATED BY THE STATE OR ANY

- 15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
- 16 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,
- 17 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
- 18 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from
- 19 the date it is enacted.
