- 9 WHEREAS, Many rural communities in Maryland are currently facing difficult
- 0 challenges relating to changing economic condition, an aging population, an
- 11 inadequate access to quality health care and other services, and a deteriorating or
- 12 inadequate physical infrastructure; and
- WHEREAS, Local governments, educational institutions, and private service
- 14 providers in rural areas are increasingly unable to meet all the economic
- 15 development, community development, and human services needs of approximately
- 16 1.4 million citizens residing in the rural counties and municipalities; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Agricultural and other resource-based enterprises continue to
- 18 underpin the local economies of rural communities, but are increasingly under threat
- 19 from national and international competition, land development pressure, and
- 20 regulatory influences; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The United States Congress passed The Farm Security and Rural
- 22 Investment Act of 2002 which potentially provides Marylanders with opportunities to
- 23 seek assistance on a variety of rural concerns including agricultural and forest land
- 24 preservation, soil and water conservation, agribusiness development, small
- 25 community water and wastewater infrastructure, safe and affordable housing,
- 26 broadband telecommunications access, and other community facilities; and
- 27 WHEREAS, The State's existing rural capacity development programs could be
- 28 combined to provide for more efficient programmatic and policy development
- 29 coordination, take better advantage of new opportunities, and enhance the
- 30 capabilities of Maryland's rural communities to deal with the difficult challenges they


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



- 7 miscellaneous supplies that were purchased by the FORVM will transfer to the Rural
- 8 Maryland Council when its offices are relocated from Baltimore to Annapolis. The
- 9 affected State agencies are also directed to assist the FORVM and Rural Maryland
- 10 Council with their telecommunications and Internet website needs to insure that
- 11 services provided to the public are maintained with a minimum level of disruption.
- 12 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as otherwise
- 13 provided in this Act, all rules and regulations, proposed rules and regulations,
- 14 standards and guidelines, proposed standards and guidelines, orders and other
- 15 directives, forms, plans, memberships, special funds, appropriations, grants, loans,
- 16 applications and commitments for grants and loans, contracts, properties,
- 17 investigations, administrative and judicial proceedings, rights to sue and be sued, and
- 18 all other duties and responsibilities associated with those functions transferred by
- 19 this Act shall continue in effect until completed, withdrawn, canceled, modified, or
- 20 otherwise changed pursuant to law.
- 21 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if any provision of this
- 22 Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any
- 23 reason in a court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other
- 24 provisions or any other application of this Act which can be given effect without the
- 25 invalid provision or application, and for this purpose the provisions of this Act, are
- 26 declared severable.
- 27 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 28 effect July 1, 2003.
