3 FOR the purpose of supporting the U.S. Armed Forces and their liberation of the Iraqi

4 people; supporting the families of the U.S. Armed Forces; supporting the

5 enforcement of Resolution 1441; and generally relating to support of the U.S.

6 Armed Forces and their liberation of the Iraqi people.

WHEREAS, Since 1991, the United States and the United Nations have worked
in accordance to numerous UN resolutions to peacefully disarm Saddam Hussein and
the Iraqi government; and

10 WHEREAS, Hussein has deliberately flouted the will of and been a threat to the 11 world community and his own people; and

WHEREAS, In September 2002, both houses of the U.S. Congress authorized
the President of the United States to use force in enforcing the numerous United
Nations resolutions against Hussein and the Iraqi government; and

WHEREAS, In November 2002, the United Nations Security Council passed
Resolution 1441 unanimously declaring Iraq in material breach of its obligations and
vowing serious consequences if Iraq did not fully and immediately disarm; and

WHEREAS, President George W. Bush has ordered military action against the
Iraqi government to uphold Resolution 1441 and the numerous resolutions requiring
Iraq to disarm; and

WHEREAS, Men and women from Maryland have been called to active duty
joining hundreds of thousands of military personnel from across the United States
and other allied nations to protect our nation and our world from the threat of
Hussein and the Iraqi government; and

WHEREAS, The families of these brave soldiers provide support to them and remind us of the bravery and importance of our armed forces; now, therefore, be it 1 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the

2 General Assembly of Maryland offers its strong support for liberating Iraq and

3 enforcing the will of Resolution 1441; and be it further
