FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 1060

(Prince George's County Delegation)

Environmental Matters

Prince George's County - State's Attorney's Office - Support Staff
PG 316-03

This bill authorizes the Prince George's County State's Attorney to appoint clerical, secretarial, administrative, and other support staff as needed to complete the duties and responsibilities of the office. The bill also provides that the salaries will be provided in the county budget. The bill clarifies that the appointed positions serve at the pleasure of the State's Attorney except those positions that are under the county's personnel policies and practices.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: None. This bill codifies existing practice in Prince George's County.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: There are no specific provisions of law authorizing the Prince George's County State's Attorney to appoint clerical, secretarial, administrative, and other support staff as needed to complete the duties and responsibilities of the office.

Background: Generally, in Baltimore City and Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Cecil, Charles, Frederick, Garrett, Harford, Kent, and St. Mary's counties the State's Attorney may appoint clerical, secretarial, administrative, or other support staff as needed to

complete the duties and responsibilities of the office. Local governing bodies in Carroll and Queen Anne's counties may appoint clerical, secretarial, administrative, or other support staff. Appointing clerical, secretarial, administrative, or other support staff as needed to complete the duties and responsibilities of the office is not specified in Allegany, Calvert, Caroline, Dorchester, Howard, Montgomery, Prince George's, Somerset, Talbot, Washington, Wicomico, and Worcester counties.
