Circuit Court Real Property Records Improvement Fund - Funding

This bill raises the surcharge from a maximum of \$5 to \$20 for each type of recordable instrument to be recorded among the land records and financing statement records.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2003.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Revenues to the Circuit Court Real Property Records Improvement Fund could increase by an estimated \$18.8 million in FY 2004. Future years assume a steady rate of instruments recorded.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Potential meaningful. Small businesses that record instruments among the land records and financing statement records may be assessed a higher surcharge.

Analysis

Current Law: The State Court Administrator may establish a surcharge not to exceed \$5 for each type of recordable instrument to be recorded among the land records and the financing statement records. The circuit court clerk's office in each county must collect

the surcharge. Receipts from the surcharge must be placed in the Circuit Court Real Property Records Improvement Fund. These surcharge provisions sunset on June 30, 2006.

Background: The Circuit Court Real Property Records Improvement Fund is a special fund used to repair, replace, improve, modernize, and update office equipment and equipment-related services in the land records office of each circuit court clerk's office. The fund currently supports two major projects: PLATO, which makes plats available online, and ELROI, which makes land records available online. All circuit court clerks' offices now have PLATO, and 13 clerks' offices currently have ELROI.

State Revenues: The Administrative Office of the Courts advises that in fiscal 2002, there were 1,256,103 instruments recorded among the land records. Increasing the surcharge on these instruments from \$5 to \$20 would result in a revenue increase of \$18,841,545 annually to the Circuit Court Real Property Records Improvement Fund, assuming that the number of instruments remains constant. Rising interest rates could lead to fewer real estate transactions and a corresponding decrease in revenues.

Additional Information

Prior Introductions: HB 906 of 2002, which would have raised the maximum surcharge from \$5 to \$10, received an unfavorable report from the House Appropriations Committee. SB 511 of 2002, the cross file to HB 906, passed the Senate but received an unfavorable report from the House Appropriations Committee.
