House Bill 102 Judiciary

(Delegate Arnick)

Counties and Municipal Corporations - Vending Machine Company Vans - Registration with Law Enforcement

This bill authorizes a police department or a sheriff's department to register the vans of a vending machine company that services vending machines in its respective jurisdiction. The bill provides that the registration of the vans is at the option of the vending machine company.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: It is expected that the bill's provisions could be handled by local law enforcement agencies with existing resources.

Small Business Effect: To the extent that the bill would prevent theft and associated losses small business vending machine companies could be positively impacted.

Analysis

Current Law: There is no provision of law that authorizes local law enforcement agencies to register the vans of a vending machine company that service vending machines in their respective jurisdictions.

Background: Local law enforcement agencies in Maryland may register armored trucks that service financial institutions in their jurisdictions for the purpose of responding to thefts and other emergencies involving armored trucks.

Additional Information

Prior Introductions: An identical bill was introduced at the 2002 session as HB 851. The bill received an unfavorable report by the House Economic Matters Committee.
