## FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE Revised

House Bill 612

(Delegates Owings and O'Donnell)

#### Criminal Law - Dogs and Cats - Killing or Poisoning

This bill increases the fine from \$500 to \$1,000 for killing, or allowing a dog or cat to be killed by a decompression chamber, carbon monoxide gas, or curariform drugs.

The bill provides that a person may not willfully and maliciously give poison or ground glass to a cat, or expose poison or ground glass with the intent that the cat ingest it. A person who violates this provision is guilty of a misdemeanor and is subject to a fine not to exceed \$1,000 for each violation. The bill also increases the fine for willfully and maliciously giving poison or ground glass to a dog from \$100 to \$1,000 for each violation.

# **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** Potential minimal increase in general fund revenues due to the bill's penalty provisions. No effect on expenditures.

## **Analysis**

**Current Law:** A person may not kill or allow a dog or cat to be killed by a decompression chamber, carbon monoxide gas, or curariform drugs. A person who violates this provision is guilty of a misdemeanor and is subject to a fine not to exceed \$500.

A person may not willfully and maliciously give poison or ground glass to a dog, or expose poison or ground glass, with the intent that the dog ingest it. A person who violates this provision is guilty of a misdemeanor and is subject to a fine not to exceed \$100 for each violation.

**State Revenues:** General fund revenues could increase minimally under the bill's monetary penalty provisions for those cases heard in the District Court.
