Senate Bill 223 (Senator Hollinger, *et al.*)

Health and Government Operations

Right to Breast-Feed

This bill grants a mother the right to breast-feed her child in any public or private location in which the mother and child are authorized to be, and forbids a person from restricting or limiting the right of a mother to breast-feed her child.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: This bill would not directly affect governmental operations or finances.

Analysis

Current Law: None applicable.

Background: According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, extensive research documents diverse advantages to infants, mothers, families, and society from breastfeeding. The academy further states that increasing the initiation and duration of breastfeeding is a national health objective.

Prior Introductions: Similar bills, SB 434/HB 641, were introduced in the 2001 session. SB 434 passed the Senate and had a hearing in the House Environmental

Matters Committee, but was not reported out of that committee. HB 641 received an unfavorable report in the Environmental Matters Committee.
