# Frederick County and Frederick City - Environmental Noise Standards - Fairgrounds - Exemption

This bill provides that the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) may not adopt environmental noise standards, sound level limits, or noise control rules and regulations that apply to noise from: (1) a fair listed in the Maryland Agricultural Fairs and Shows Schedule; or (2) any other event held on the same grounds as a fair. The bill applies only in Frederick County and Frederick City.

The bill takes effect June 1, 2003.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. The bill would not significantly affect State operations or finances.

**Local Effect:** None. The bill would not significantly affect local operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

#### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** MDE establishes noise standards, sound level limits, and noise control rules and regulations as necessary to protect the public health, the general welfare, and property. MDE is not authorized to adopt standards, limits, or rules and regulations that apply to noise from construction or repair work on public property or fire or rescue station alerting devices. MDE must enforce the noise control rules and regulations. To

the extent possible, MDE must use the facilities and services of appropriate agencies of political subdivisions in its enforcement.

**Background:** The only fair in Frederick County or Frederick City that was listed in the Maryland Agricultural Fairs and Shows Schedule for 2002 was the Great Frederick Fair held at the Frederick Fairgrounds in Frederick City. Numerous events, such as animal field days and agricultural events, are also held at the fairgrounds.
