House Bill 595 Appropriations (Delegate Proctor, et al.)

Budget and Taxation

State Retirement and Pension System - Board of Trustees - Membership

This pension bill alters the eligibility requirements for membership on the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement and Pension System of Maryland (SRPS). The bill requires that one of the two trustees who are elected by teachers' system members and retirees must be a retiree, while current law requires that only one of those two trustees may be a retiree.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill does not change the total number of trustees or otherwise affect pension board expenditures.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Of the 14-member board, two trustees are members or retirees of the TRS or TPS, only one of whom may be a retiree at the time of election.

Background: Six members on the board are elected by active members, retirees, beneficiaries, and former vested members of the various systems. As indicated above, two are elected by teachers' systems participants. Two other board members are elected by State Police Retirement System participants; one of these board members must be a retiree at the time of election. Finally, two other board members are elected by all the participants of the Employees' Retirement System (ERS), Employees' Pension System

(EPS), the Correctional Officers' Retirement System (CORS), the Judges' Retirement System (JRS), the Legislative Pension Plan (LPP), the Local Fire and Police Retirement System (LFP), and the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System (LEOPS). The distribution of elected board members and plan participants is illustrated in **Exhibit 1**.

Prior Introductions: The bill, as amended, is identical to several past bills, including HB 1060 of 1997, SB 807 of 1997, and HB 186 of 1998. None passed.
