Carroll County - Alcoholic Beverages - Servers in Restaurants

This bill repeals the restriction in Carroll County that anyone age 18 or older serving or selling alcoholic beverages must do so in connection with the serving and selling of a meal. The bill also authorizes a person of 18 or older to deliver alcoholic beverages in a restaurant.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Carroll County finances would not be affected by changing restrictions on who may serve, sell, or deliver alcoholic beverages.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: In Carroll County, restaurants may employ a person age 15 or older to perform any task other than those involving selling, serving, or delivering alcoholic beverages. A person age 18 or older may serve and sell alcoholic beverages in restaurants in connection with the serving and selling of a meal.
