#### FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

Senate Bill 207 (Senator Pinsky) Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

#### **Election Law - Prohibited Acts - Walk-Around Services - Application**

This bill expands the prohibition against paying for "walk-around services" on election day to include all persons.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** The bill would not directly affect State operations or finances.

**Local Effect:** None.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

### Analysis

**Current Law:** The election code prohibits a campaign finance entity, or a person acting on its behalf, to directly or indirectly pay or incur an obligation to pay for walk-around services.

Walk-around services include the following activities performed for money while polls are open:

- distributing campaign material;
- stationing a person, including oneself, or an object, in the path of a voter;
- electioneering or canvassing;
- communicating in any other manner, a voting preference or choice; or

• performing any other service as a poll worker or distributor of sample ballots.
